#### Awareness Program on Acid Attacks familial and societal support for victims of such brutal crimes. organized by Brave Soul NGO

15th February, 2025



In a groundbreaking initiative aimed at raising awareness about acid attacks and the struggles faced by survivors, Brave Soul NGO organized an insightful awareness program at DME (Delhi Metropolitan Event) on 15th Feburary,2025. The event featured an enriching discussion led by prominent lawyers, acid attack survivors, and social activists, providing a platform to understand the complexities of acid attacks and the urgent need for systemic change.

The session was opened by Ms. Tooba, a former advocate at Brave Soul NGO, who began by defining violence in its most basic form, explaining how it manifests both physically and psychologically in various contexts. She elaborated on the definition of violence according to the World Health Organization (WHO), discussing the multiple forms and dimensions of harm it causes. Ms. Tooba particularly focused on acid attacks, explaining the broader implications of such violence and highlighting the discrimination survivors face in society. She discussed the negative impact of patriarchy as a driving force behind acid attacks, which fuels harmful societal perceptions, especially towards women.

Addressing the challenges faced by survivors, Ms. Tooba shared a detailed analysis of issues such as blindness, depression, and the financial barriers preventing many victims from receiving the proper medical treatment. She highlighted that many survivors undergo 20-25 surgeries throughout their recovery journey, yet remain demotivated by a society that often fails to offer adequate support. Ms. Tooba also discussed the role of future generations in preventing such heinous crimes and encouraged the youth to redefine beauty beyond physical appearance. She emphasized the importance of challenging superficial ideals of beauty and shifting societal perceptions towards inner qualities. Furthermore, Ms. Tooba pointed out the discrepancy between the frequency of acid attacks and the lack of adequate reporting, stressing the need for heightened sensitivity towards issues like gender violence, child abuse, and sexual assault.

A student, deeply moved by the presentation, passionately took the microphone, stating, "We should not be silent about heinous crimes; we must raise our voices." She concluded with an empowering quote:

"A king does not work alone."

Following the speeches, the audience was shown a powerful video recording of acid attack survivors, highlighting their personal stories and the transformative efforts of the Brave Soul Foundation NGO and Ms. Shaheen Malik. The video showcased how these survivors, despite immense struggles, have risen to become advocates for change.

One of the survivors, Ms. Reema, shared her moving experience, recalling how she met Ms. Shaheen Malik, who became her pillar of strength throughout her healing journey. Reema emphasized that true beauty lies in the heart, not in outward appearance. Despite undergoing 23 surgeries, Reema encouraged the audience to never give up. Another survivor, Ms. Ruman Saifi, recounted the horrors of being forced to drink acid by an assailant. She thanked her father for his unwavering support during her darkest days and lauded Ms. Shaheen Malik for being an ever-present source of support. Ruman's story reinforced the importance of

Ms. Srija, Senior Law Officer at Brave Soul Foundation, provided a comprehensive overview of acid use and its regulation. She discussed the landmark Laxmi Agarwal vs. Union of India (2013) case, which played a significant role in shaping legal frameworks for acid attack survivors. She also highlighted the Supreme Court guidelines, which stipulate that retailers should maintain a register of buyers when selling acid, ensuring accountability in its distribution. Ms. Srija discussed the punishments prescribed for acid attacks under Section 115 of BNS and Section 323 of IPC, comparing the legal provisions in both frameworks. She also highlighted the gaps in procedural timelines and the challenges survivors face in accessing timely compensation.

Furthermore, Ms. Srija discussed the PMNRF scheme, which provides an additional ₹1 lakh to acid attack survivors, and the emotional, financial, and legal support survivors desperately need to rebuild their lives.

The event concluded with a thank-you speech from Dr. Ravi Kant Swami, who emphasized an optimistic approach to life, urging everyone to maintain a positive and resilient mindset. He shared two simple yet profound pieces of advice: Always

Outward appearance doesn't matter; it's your inner strength that counts.

Brave Soul NGO's awareness program successfully illuminated the harsh realities faced by acid attack survivors and underscored the need for greater societal and legal support. The event was a poignant reminder of the power of resilience, the importance of collective action, and the need to challenge outdated norms and prejudices. It also served as a call to action for the youth to stand up for justice, raise their voices against gender violence, and work towards a future where such heinous crimes become a thing of the past.

This event marked a significant step toward empowering acid attack survivors and fostering awareness of the urgent need for systemic change in both social and legal

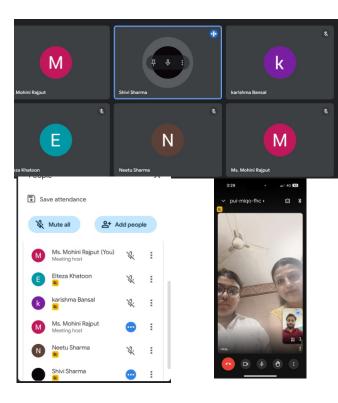

#### Visit to Vigyan Bhawan

3rd April, 2025

The Bharat Shiksha Summit, organized by the Balaji Foundation on 3rd April 2025 at Vigyan Bhawan, New Delhi under the guidance of Mrs. Swati Sharma. It was a prestigious and intellectually stimulating event centered around the theme "Shaping the Future of Learning." The summit served as a platform for distinguished speakers from various fields—law, policy, education, and governance—to engage in meaningful discussions about the current and future state of education in India.

The event commenced with the inaugural address delivered by Hon'ble Justice Rajesh Bindal, Judge, Supreme Court of India. In his speech, Justice Bindal addressed the systemic gaps in the Indian education system. He emphasized the need for reformation in the teaching pattern, which currently follows a rigid structure where students are required to study both mandatory and optional subjects, often without a clear understanding of their relevance. Justice Bindal advocated for a subject-based and interest-driven curriculum that empowers students to pursue knowledge more meaningfully and practically.

Shri Pradeep Rai, Senior Advocate, Supreme Court of India, followed with an impactful speech. He stressed the importance of an education system that goes beyond academics and equips students with values, skills, and ethical reasoning, which are essential for holistic development and nation-building.

One of the key highlights of the event was the reference to the "Vision 20–35" document, a visionary framework for educational transformation released on 3rd January 2016. This vision laid out strategies for aligning Indian education with global standards and enhancing quality, accessibility, and innovation across all levels of learning. Another critical issue addressed during the summit was brain drain. The speakers expressed concern over the growing number of Indian students pursuing education and employment abroad due to limitations in local institutions. The need to retain talent by improving educational infrastructure, encouraging research, and creating globally competitive opportunities in India was heavily emphasized.

Prof. Pankaj Mittal, representing National Law University, provided valuable insights into the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. He described the policy as a game changer, aiming to make education more inclusive, multidisciplinary, and accessible at the doorstep. He also emphasized the importance of international collaboration to raise the academic standards of Indian institutions and make them globally competitive.

An inspiring segment of the summit was led by Dr. Tanu Jain, Ex IPS Officer and Influencer, who motivated the students by sharing her personal journey. She emphasized the role of discipline, time management, and self-confidence in achieving success. Her interaction encouraged students to embrace change and continuously strive for growth, both personally and professionally.

A noteworthy address was delivered by Shri Manoj Sinha, Hon'ble Lieutenant Governor of Jammu & Kashmir. He brought a unique perspective to the summit by highlighting the significance of writing as an essential part of the learning process. According to him, writing helps enhance comprehension, improves communication skills, and fosters critical thinking. He urged students to integrate writing into their academic habits to become more articulate and thoughtful learners.



The summit was attended by 35 students from diverse academic backgrounds, primarily from the fields of management and law. Their active participation and curiosity added vibrancy to the event. Students had the opportunity to interact with the speakers, ask questions, and gain first-hand insights into policy-making, legal perspectives, and academic reforms. The dining etiquette component offered a hands-on experience in navigating formal meal settings, with emphasis on correct table manners, use of cutlery, and polite interaction at business meals.

Overall, the Professional Image Management workshop was a highly enriching and transformative experience. It enabled students to build confidence, sharpen their interpersonal skills, and understand the importance of presenting themselves with intention and professionalism. DMEs initiative in organizing this workshop reflects its commitment to student development beyond academics, preparing learners to make a strong impression in the corporate world. The expert guidance of Ms. Surya Singh left a lasting impact on all participants, inspiring them to take charge of their image and align it with their personal and professional aspirations.

DME Management School recently concluded its Placement Week, which saw the participation of 14 esteemed companies. 19 students were selected across various companies, with the selected student list attached below.

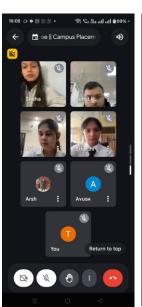

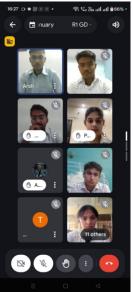

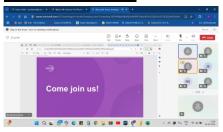
